

Yue Wang received his B.S. and M.S. degrees in electrical and computer engineering from Shanghai Jiao Tong University in 1984 and 1987 respectively. He received his Ph.D. degree in electrical engineering from University of Maryland Graduate School in 1995. In 1996, he was a postdoctoral fellow at Georgetown University School of Medicine. From 1996 to 2003, he was an assistant and later associate professor of electrical engineering at The Catholic University of America. In 2003, he joined Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University and is currently a full professor of electrical, computer, and biomedical engineering.
